CATHERINE KIMBERLEY APPOINTED AS DELEGATE TO THE AMERICAN BAR ASSOCIATION HOUSE OF DELEGATES

Catherine Kimberley, a Smith Anderson associate, has been appointed as a delegate to the American Bar Association (ABA) House of Delegates on behalf of the North Carolina State Bar (NC State Bar). Ms. Kimberley has been active in various professional activities, most recently as Co-Chair of the Pro Bono and Poverty Issues Committee of the Young Lawyer Division of the North Carolina Bar Association. Ms. Kimberley's appointment as a Delegate is for a two-year term and will begin at the end of the ABA annual meeting in August 2009, to be held in Chicago, Illinois.
