### WALTER ROGERS TEACHES COURSE AT DUKE LAW SCHOOL

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**RALEIGH, N.C.** – Walter R. Rogers, Jr., partner in Smith Anderson’s tax practice group, recently taught a course at Duke Law School as a part of the Law School’s clinical education program. In the course, “Creating an Entity,” students learned to prepare organizational documents for business corporations and limited liability companies. The course also provided an introduction to the variety of legal entities available for business and philanthropic purposes, the several legal disciplines (e.g., corporation law, tax law, securities law, and commercial law) involved in the formation of an entity, and related choice of entity considerations. Students prepared organizational documents for a business corporation and a limited liability company.
